

# President's Message

At this time of writing the club is still having to deal with the challenges of the Covid pandemic with the later part of the rowing season having to be put on hold due to public orders. This years AGM has also been delayed because of the gathering restrictions imposed by public health orders.

Membership numbers have taken a slight dip from last year but there is a broad general interest in rowing within the community focusing on what will happen after restrictions are eased after we reach the magic vaccination threshold. Our trusted secretary Maria O'Connor was again there to add extra covid checks to keep the membership in order.

The club finances have taken a financial hit from reduced income from other sources such as not being able to hire out the hall, sponsorships or being able to run learn to row courses due to Covid restrictions. In this domain on behalf of the club I would like to express appreciation to Mark Thompson for maintaining the accounts and providing information that has allowed the committee to make decisions.

In an even more challenging year than last the club needs to acknowledge the work of our two captains Nick MacDonald and Renate Ipjma for the running of boats and crews at regattas. I would also like to thank Zoe Morrision and June Roberts for managing the feed-in learn and intermediate crews that have produced many ongoing dedicated club members

Balmain Rowing club together with RNSW undertook to develop a model for indoor rowing as a sport in its own right. "Community Crew" was developed as a template for other rowing clubs to adopt we are looking forward to see what this will produce in the future. Thank you to Matthew Braithwaite Young for his stewardship of this program.

Joe Thoennes has continued on in his role as boat master constantly challenging us to take ownership of the fleet. Joe has taken on many challenges him self that has allowed us to be organised.

To keep us on top of the changing requirements of the government orders relating to the Covid pandemic please thank Jeremy Child for liaising with RNSW and making sense of Health NSW requirements for the members.

Fundraising events this year was restricted to a single social event (again not a yellow chair event) by Juliette Annard, Vic Clay and Rose Russell. Sadly we had to cancel planned music events due to health orders but we look forward to restarting these when the restrictions are lifted.

With safety and governance I would like to thank June Roberts, Janine Lippi and Polly Pickles for undertaking and maintaining membership governance roles and Bob Greaves for maintaining and enhancing safety procedures for members and the building

Our media face is always a challenge Id like to acknowledge the work of Matthew Braithwaite Young for guiding the club in the PR domain and Rose Russell for maintaining our website.

On Thursday, 17 June 2021 at BankWest Stadium, Balmain Rowing Club won the Community Club of 2021 at the NSW Community Sports Awards!. This award recognises the efforts and achievements of the entire club and our amazing volunteers. The NSW Community Sports Awards, presented by Sport NSW, recognise outstanding achievements and contributions to community sport in NSW, made possible by a volunteer workforce.

After a decade and a half of trying to secure funding for a general building renovation the clubs "grant writing team" were rewarded with the news of the approval of a \$1M grant from the Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund through the NSW government. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Richard Armitage who masterminded and perused the application . This year we have also been successful in gaining funding from the Community Building Partnership and 2019/20 and the Local Sports Grant Program (ergs) through the office of Jamie Parker.

With this funding we will this year undertake general building renovation and the purchase of specific equipment for the junior program. Thank you Richard and Jamie

We are nowhere without our team of volunteers. Top of the list is our team of coaches and squad leaders who were there to coach and manage squads also there is a team of dedicated individuals happy to help all of these individual tasks completed make for a structured, clean and healthy environment to participate the club owes our success to your efforts.

To close this year I'd like to say that the next 8 months dealing with the building project is not going to be an easy run to the line. Whilst the funding is "just in time" there is the ongoing challenge dealing with tight budget, heritage building, latent conditions and moderating user expectations. Be sure to recognise that the works represent a huge challenge going forward but essential for the survival of the very club itself. The building and the culture of BRC has been handed down to us through a long unbroken chain of participants and carers reaching back 140 years, we are to do our bit to ensure that the club survives to meet the needs and standards of future generations.





# Captain's Report

In the Rowing New South Wales 2020-21 season BRC scored 379 premiership points, finishing ninth on the table. 259 points were earned by our all conquering BRC para athletes – great work! This last season was again affected dramatically by Covid 19. The season featured nineteen cancelled or postponed regattas so it was especially pleasing that the second half of the season was able to run safely, including the championship events.

Head races and time trials feature in the beginning of each season. While it was sad the annual trip to Melbourne for the Head of the Yarra did not go ahead, BRC compensated by fielding crews in most head races. We secured places or category wins in the North Shore Head, the Shoalhaven Head, the Iron Cove Classics and the "Not the Head of the Yarra". Particularly pleasing was the Shoalhaven event. It was great to see that thirty BRC athletes took the trip to make it worthwhile and came home with four places out of seven entries.

Side by side racing gathered steam in the second half of the season. The State Championships produced a basket of medals for our paraathletes – four gold, three silver and two bronze. Congratulations to the athletes for these championship performances. Medal wining performances really boost the points score due to the all important multiplier effect of these events.

Our own regatta was held on St Valentines day. Forty-five events, two hundred and thirty seven entries and three hundred and eight athletes participating! This was a typical iron cove regatta and as always I would like to thank the wonderful volunteers who make these events possible.

Our athletes returned eighteen wins or places from thirty six entries – a great strike rate for our modest community club. It was really

satisfying to see wins across a broad range of events – novice scullers, juniors, para athletes, classy masters ladies and even some masters men masquerading as D-grade athletes. A thoroughly enjoyable days racing for the club.

Cancellations made the end of the season difficult, so it was sad to see a reduced number of entries at the Ed Trickett regatta to close the season. Despite this, once more BRC para athletes put force on the levers, bringing home three gold, two silver and three bronze medals. A champion performance from a group of champion athletes!

This last season has delivered many challenges and new experiences. We have lived through and with the Covid-19 pandemic, and the club has done its best to support members during this difficult time. Many of our members work on the front line of the pandemic, and to those members I give my thanks and appreciation.

Despite the pandemic our membership continues to work hard on improving the activities of the club. Reflecting on the efforts of the membership in the last few years I am particularly pleased to consider the following:

- The renewal of the fleet more than \$60,000 worth of new equipment in recent years, much of it paid for by members donations
- · The Balmain High program, bringing rowing to local students.
- · The indoor rowing pilot supporting RNSW.
- The profound increase in representation at the Head of the Yarra by BRC crews.



- Numerous camps, coaching clinics and representation at interstate or international events.
- Efforts to enhance quality and availability of coaching, as well as supporting junior coaches on their journey.
- · Efforts to offer a consistent and good value Learn to Row program.
- Collaboration with local businesses and institutions and even our competitors!

Many members have worked long and hard for these outcomes – thank you!

I am particularly pleased to deeply thank and commend the efforts of President Joe Grech, Richard Armitage and Treasurer Mark Thomson for their success in securing the grant to update the club building. This is a once in a generation activity that will secure the presence of the club in the community for years to come. We all know renovation is inconvenient but we also know that the need is pressing. Please thank them and support them as they guide us through this vital project in the coming months.

Thank-you Vice Captain Renate Ijpma and indeed the whole committee for your support and patience while Cassie and I figured out how to parent. In early March, we were thrilled to welcome baby Frankie. Unsurprisingly this young man demanded our attention so we both stepped away from the club for a while as we came to know our baby boy. For those wondering he has yet to get measured up

for a BRC zootie but he does have a fine set of West Coast Eagles accessories.

As our circumstances change so does the focus of our energies. This last season is my last season as Captain. After four years (plus a few months) as Captain and nine on the committee I am pleased to pass these responsibilities onto the next cohort of leaders. They will continue to take the club in a positive direction. I'm excited to see where they take the club and I offer my support for their efforts.

It has been a complete privilege to be supported in my efforts by the patience and sagacity of President Joe Grech, the knowledge, contacts and good humour of Owen Nix from RNSW and the support of two fantastic vice captains over the four year– Renate Ijpma and Emma Monkton (nee Forsdick). Any successes the club enjoyed in the last four years were almost certainly aided by these guys, any disasters were most likely me.

Finally thank you to all the members, old boys and girls, athletes, volunteers, coaches, supporters, donors, helpers and friends who've made the last four years a genuine adventure. I look forward to training, competing, and sharing fellowship with you as we work on making BRC an even better place to be.

# **Treasurer's Report**

### Another disruptive year. Another small profit

The fact that BRC made a profit might surprise everyone as we live through COVID.

The club's Balance Sheet remains strong with net assets of \$1,052,696.

The club's audited net profit was \$10,135 compared to last year's profit of \$1,095.

Our cash position increased (as at 31 March 2021) to \$256,685 compared to \$205,243 the previous year.

So whilst BRC has a strong Balance Sheet, has made a profit and has increased its cash position, it also had its largest rowing loss in 10 years of \$67,337.

The only reason a profit was made is because of 4 grants that should be acknowledged as follows:

- 1. \$1,000 Rowing NSW
- 2. \$3,200 Inner West Council
- 3. \$4,750 NSW Office of Sport
- 4. \$32,000 NSW Government 2019 Community Building Partnership Program

I can confirm that the club has no borrowings and negligible liabilities. The trailer, club-house, fleet and fixtures and fittings are fully insured. The shed has a fire safety check every six months.

### **Rowing loss**

The rowing loss highlights that the club relies on income over and above membership renewals. The club's expenses for this year were \$182,043 but its membership income was \$83,668, so the difference has to be made up mostly by fundraising with a little bit of help from the net profit.

Hall Hire income reduced from \$44,656 (2019) to \$30,635 (2020) to \$29,134 (2021) as at 31 March 2021. Due to the impact of COVID, hall hirers cancelled events and there has been no income from Hall Hire since the latest lockdown. This much needed income is normally the club's most regular and consistent income, but not this year. So after last year where BRC did not get any grants, your Committee puts in a lot of work behind the scenes to submit complicated grant applications.

Grants and Donations - \$43,860

Sponsorship - \$4,350 thanks to Cobden and Hayson and Balmain Sports Medicine and Ian Toll

Fundraising - \$128 - COVID related drop

Total Fundraising was \$77,472 for the year ending 31 March 2021.

### Where does the money go?

Depreciation expense - \$36,711 - accounting treatment of a noncash item. The club de-preciates the following items according to accounting principles: clubhouse, property im-provements, club equipment and fleet and equipment.

Coaching expenses \$36,665.

Insurance - \$32,877 - for shed, club equipment, fleet and equipment and the trailer.

Maintenance of the shed (\$25,433) and the fleet (\$11,331), fuel (\$1,247), cleaning (\$3,391), utilities (\$3,699), rates (\$1,856), fees (\$910), levies (\$6,901) and a host of other charges.

#### Who does the work?

Your seat fees - Melita Stimpson runs our Seat Fee Account and sends funds to RNSW, tracks your payments and unfortunately has to ask you for money. Marie-Laure Ay-monier has agreed to take on this responsibility. Thanks so much Melita and welcome ML.

Your membership - Maria O'Connor, BRC Secretary who runs Revolutionise, our mem-bership software system.

Your hall hire - Louella Oswald - does a great job making sure the shed is up to stand-ard.

Your grant applications - Joe Grech, Richard Armitage and Matthew Braithwaite-Young have all contributed to various grant applications. These 3 deserve the credit in making this year's profit.

Your Boatmaster - invaluable work done by Joe Thoennes - you may have noticed the reorganisation and improvements to the shed.

Your Committee - finance accountability and governance lies with the Committee, that is, accounts payable, accounts receivable, banking, BAS lodgement, MYOB reconciliations, cash flow, grant applications, insurance, Australian Sports Foundation funding, end-of-year financial statements and audit.

Your Committee - chases sponsorship funds - it is not an easy task to successfully ask businesses to part with money so I'd like to thank Joe Grech and Matthew Braithwaite-Young in particular.

### Post 31 March 2021 significant matters:

The effect of COVID-19 on the club.

COVID-19 is having and will continue to have a significant impact on BRC. The club has lost its hall hire income, its sponsorships and income from social gatherings. Unfortunate-ly this is what I wrote last year.

I've saved the biggest story for BRC until last. The club has been successful in be-ing granted \$1.0m by the Office of Sport - Greater Cities Sport Facility Fund. The 'what for?' will be covered elsewhere in this annual report by Joe Grech. The club has to find more funds to add to the grant money and we are well on the way. I want to acknowledge the enormous amount of weeknight and weekend work Richard Armitage, Joe Grech and Matthew Braithwaite-Young put in to get this grant for the benefit of BRC and its members.

# **Building Report**

The redoubling of efforts toward landing a sizable grant to undertake a general building refurbishment has paid dividends this year with the news of the awarding of \$1M grant from the Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund through the NSW government. The news was welcomed with relief, joy and trepidation in equal measure.

Relief because we have known for some time that the building is structurally suffering from the affects of old age and sea level rise and that substantial sums needed to be spent to ensure the building survives. Joy because we always knew that we could never realise this type of money through ordinary fundraising and trepidation at managing and getting through the next eight months of actual building work and what sort of organisation that needs and what affect that would have on the membership

As this goes to print what we can build is being determined. Thanks to fund raising and accumulated funds (thank you all past fund raisers) the club has in the order of \$1.2M to spend. Whilst this sounds like a lot of money sadly at least 400K will be spent below the boathouse floor level leaving insufficient funds to realise the entire approved project.

The project "Base build" project will deal with the core building issues and deliver a comfortable boatshed. For our budget the base build scope has so far been defined as

- · new piers and support structure under 1882 shed
- raise 1882 shed
- · refurbish both boathouse level and hall level
- · side access way
- · extend staging to the west and relocate existing pontoon.

The project can then be structured so that if funds become available through further fundraising the approved parts of the project can be undertaken within including

- · East extension (two storey extension toward the street) +190K
- · Enclosing the north staging area (between us and the park)+190K
- · Large finger pontoon +400K.

At the last committee meeting the committee voted unanimously to proceed with the project and trigger access to the grant funding


With Covid 19 already disrupting the season it would be good to get the project done in the same year so that we hit the next season running.


Thanks to all for your ongoing support in the various building projects undertaken at the shed to date and in this coming year.

# **Archive Report**

Balmain Rowing Club has officially entered into its 140th year!

In the past twelve months we have continued to look back on the historical events which have formed the rich history of our old Club. We revisited Federation Day (January 1901) by showcasing a wonderful photo from our Archives of an historic scene of Balmain Rowing club's Federal regatta, 120 years ago. The photo was taken from White Horse Point showing the regatta and Flagship E & A Co's "SS Australian". Our archives also hold a scanned copy of the 1901 Federal Regatta Programme which is a classic for its time and can be been viewed on our website.

Earlier this year we took the opportunity to improve the design of our club medal. This piqued my interest to research the history behind the unique design which was introduced in 2012. It was discovered that the design of our medal is a replication of an original 1892 BRC medal. The original 1892 medal was designed, engraved and donated by the renowned Sydney engraver and jeweller Harold Berthold. The medals were described as silver, suitably inscribed and with an engraving of the club premises on the obverse". These were one off medals, for one special event, therefore only five were cast. The medal we copied was presented to number three seat, Charles McNeill, it has survived and housed at the Maritime Museum who allowed me to view and photograph this precious item.

In 1993 BRC's Mick Ryan, took the time to interview Bill Nix on his memories of the men on our WWI Honor board. Bill was in his 90th year and his memory was sharp giving us a vivid glimpse into the men's lives with his entertaining old rowing yarns. With the use of new technology I was able to enhance some old photos of the men by bringing them to life, this combined with the voices of the late Bill Nix and Mick Ryan, created a unique tribute to Balmain Rowing club's WWI Oarsmen. I forwarded the finished project onto Bill Nix's family and their reply was touching - Thank you so much for sending through the recording of uncle Billy. The voice was so recognisable. It brought a tear to my eye. Billy was a very proud member of the Balmain Rowing Club and naming a skiff in his honour was an indicator of the club's mutual respect for him. Our Anzac memorial dawn row is a profound event and continues to be well attended by BRC members. Each Anzac Day our crews push off the pontoon before dawn, assembling at White Horse Point for a short service and the laying of eleven floral tributes in honour of our eleven oarsmen who made the supreme sacrifice. In keeping with the Anzac spirit, bagpipes are played from White Horse Point by club member Jeremy Child. After the service crews continue with a memorial row down Iron Cove, on the waters these men once rowed. On the return to the club crews race in the 500 metre Dardanelles Dash! Back at the shed we have breakfast before the reading of letters written over 100 years ago by our Oarsman at the front.

In 2020 we remembered the little piece of history about a local waterman, Charles Pritchard, who, in 1880 built a small timber boat shed at White Horse Point with great hopes of operating a local ferry service. Pritchard's timber structure still stands today and is part of the Balmain Rowing club shed. On the 10th June 1882, the shed was purchased by BRC where it was deemed by the founding BRC Committee that "the boat shed would be of no use to the club" and would be removed as scrap. The little shed was not demolished and 140 years on our recently renovated kitchen and bathrooms occupy the upper level of the original boatman's shed. There are still no plans to scrap the old waterman's boat shed!



- 1968 Won Double Sculls & Eight Oar NSW titles.
- 1968 Won Australian Eight Oar title.
- 1968 Represented Australia at the Mexico Olympics in Eight Oar crew and won the silver medal, loosing by .90 of a second.
- 1969 Won Eight Oar State title.
- 1970 Won Eight Oar State title and stroked the Kings cup crew for the Aust. titles.
- 1971 Reserve in 1971 NSW Eight at the Kings Cup.
